
In 2021, 60% of teachers polled said they felt burnout due to job - related stress.

Building Sustainable Pedagogy: Less Is More

Research shows that more work does not equate to higher academic achievement.

> Consider how much and how often you're grading. If you find yourself constantly behind, you're likely assigning too much (for both you and scholars).

Suggested Sweet Spot: 2 Formatives per week Bi-Weekly Summatives

Building Sustainable Pedagogy: Maximize Class Time

Create Opportunities to Check Students Understanding in Real Time.



- Use Polling & Survey platforms for automatic grading & data compilation.
- Collaborate with scholars to create peer feed back groups and rubrics for larger assignments.

Building Sustainable Pedagogy: Collaborate

Split the teaching and the grading! Utilize Grade Level Teams to co-plan and execute cross collaborative units.

Scholarly Collab:

• Create opportunities for students to teach and learn from one another.

- Use the return week as an opportunity to collectively reset.
